

## MARANA WASTEWATER TIMELINE

<b>1979</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Marana signs Pima County's contract for sewer service (Sewer IGA)</li> <li>• Under the Sewer IGA:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Pima County provides sewer service</li> <li>○ Pima County keeps all fees (service and new connection)</li> <li>○ Either party may terminate upon six months' notice</li> <li>○ Upon termination, all non-flow-through infrastructure in Marana reverts to Marana</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>1989</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Marana residents vote in favor of the Town operating its own wastewater system</li> </ul>
<b>2004-06</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Marana and Pima County discuss Marana acquisition of effluent or of the north sewer system               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ County refuses to discuss Marana acquisition of any portion of the system</li> <li>○ County offers return of Marana's effluent with so many deductions that almost no effluent would actually come to Marana</li> <li>○ 19 businesses are refused sewer capacity letters, so they cannot build</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>2007</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Marana provides six months' notice of termination to Pima County, per the Sewer IGA</li> <li>• Marana initiates and completes a Rate Study</li> <li>• Marana initiates and completes a Sewer Basin Study</li> <li>• Marana offers Pima County several possible solutions including purchase</li> <li>• Pima County refuses all offers</li> <li>• Marana files suit after Pima County expresses its intention not to comply with the Sewer IGA</li> </ul>
<b>2008</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Marana prepared for wastewater utility start-up</li> <li>• The Sewer IGA terminates date deadline to comply to pass</li> <li>• Pima County retaliates by:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ denying voter-approved regional bond funding for Marana airport sewer line</li> <li>○ denying CDBG funding assigned to Marana for low-income housing</li> <li>○ delaying funding for vital Twin Peaks Interchange construction project</li> <li>○ denying committed funding for the Camino de Mañana road construction project</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Marana initiates PAG 208 amendment as required by the Clean Water Act               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Pima County deliberately stalls the 208 amendment for two years</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Marana Town Council adopts wastewater rates and establishes an enterprise fund</li> <li>• Marana offers Pima County several possible solutions including purchase</li> <li>• Pima County refuses all offers</li> </ul>
<b>2009-10</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The lawsuit continues</li> <li>• Marana offers Pima County several possible solutions including purchase</li> <li>• Pima County refuses all offers</li> </ul>
